Key tip: If your chosen source has no author and no date, the webpage might not be the best source to use as support since there is no way to confirm who wrote the information or when it was posted. To ensure it is reliable, make sure the webpage belongs to a reputable or governmental organization.

* Key tip: When the page is authored and published by the same corporation/group/organization, begin your citation with the article / section title.
